### U.S. Constitution

#### Article I

**Section 8:** The Congress shall have Power to . . . "establish . . . uniform Laws on the subject of Bankruptcies throughout the United States"

Bankruptcy Court is a <u>Federal</u> Court State Court "receiverships" are not bankruptcy cases.






































## Bankruptcy

• A procedure to relieve debtors of their obligations and to address creditors' claims in an organized fashion.

## Types of bankruptcy proceedings

- Chapter 7 Straight liquidation.
- Chapter 13 Wage earner reorganization.
- Chapter 11 Business reorganization.
- Chapter 12 Farmer reorganization.

### Section 301-303

Commencement of case

- Requires petition.
- Voluntary/Involuntary.
- Estate created when petition filed.

## Automatic Stay – Section 362

- Applies in all cases; applies immediately upon commencement of case; no order needed.
- Purpose to give debtor interim protection from creditor demands.

### What is stayed - Section 362(a) (non-inclusive)

- Commencement or continuation of a prepetition action against the debtor.
- Enforcement of prepetition judgment against debtor or property of the estate.
- Any act to obtain possession or control of property of
- Any act to enforce lien against property of the estate or
- Any act to collect or recover a prepetition claim against

### Exceptions to stay – Section 362(b) (non-inclusive)

- Criminal proceedings against debtor.
- Civil proceeding regarding paternity, domestic support obligations, child custody/visitation, domestic violence or divorce (other than property division involving property of the
- Collection of domestic support obligation.
- Suspension or restriction of driver's license.
- Governmental unit's enforcement of its police and regulatory powers.
- Eviction of debtor from rented residence if judgment of possession obtained prepetition unless debtor meets certain criteria.
- · Eviction of debtor from leased commercial space if lease had expired prepetition.

## Relief from automatic stay -Section 362(d)

- Cause e.g. uncompensated asset depreciation, lack of insurance, personal injury claim limited to insurance
- No equity / not necessary for effective reorganization.

## Termination of Automatic Stay – Section 362(c)

- Stay is not indefinite.
- Stay terminates with respect to estate property when property is no longer "property of the estate".
- Terminates when case is dismissed or closed or when individual debtor receives discharge.
- Discharge and exemption stay replaces automatic stay.

## Exemptions - Section 522

- Individual debtor may keep some property for a "fresh start".
- State v. federal scheme of exemptions
- Typical exempt property home, car, household furnishings, retirement accounts.
- Many exemptions subject to maximum values (e.g. \$20,200 max. on residence under federal scheme).

### Discharge – Chapter 7 – Section 727

- Granted only to individual debtor; typically granted 120-180 days after case filed.
- Applies to all nondischargeable debts that arose before the order for relief, which is the petition date.

## Exception to discharge – Section 727(a)

- Established by objection/court proceeding.
- Examples (non-inclusive).
  - > Prepetition or postpetition destruction/concealment of property with intent to defraud.
  - > False oath with intent to defraud.
  - > Refusal to obey lawful court order.
  - > Prior Chapter 7 case commenced within 8 years of current petition date.
  - > Prior Chapter 13 case commenced within 6 years of current petition date.

### Effect of discharge – Section 524

- Voids any judgment that establishes the debtor's personal liability with respect to prepetition debt.
- Enjoins all acts, including litigation, to collect any debt that arose prepetition.

## Non-dischargeable debts – Section 523 (non-inclusive)

- Applies to Chapter 7, 11, & 12 discharges and Chapter 13 hardship discharges.
- Only specific debt is excepted / otherwise, discharge is granted.
  - > Taxes Section 523(a)(1).
  - ➤ Money or other property obtained by fraud Section 523(a)(2).
  - > Money or other property taken by embezzlement, larceny, or breach of trust 523(a)(4).
  - > Domestic support obligations Section 523(a)(5).
  - ➤ Willful and malicious injuries against persons or property Section 523(a)(6).
